Mandate	<p>This Action Package seeks to implement guidance and models on behaviours, policies, and practices to minimize the spill over, spread, and full emergence of zoonotic disease into or out of human populations proper to the development of efficient human-to-human transmission.</p> <p>ZDAP aims to support its members to develop and strengthen their capacity and capability to prepare for, prevent, detect, and respond to zoonotic disease threats, using a One Health¹ approach.</p>
ZDAP priorities	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Develop and strengthen coordination, communication, multi-sectoral engagement, and information sharing among member countries involved in the ZDAP.2. Strengthen the technical capacities of animal, human, wildlife and environmental health services to support zoonotic diseases prevention, detection, and response activities, using a One Health approach.3. Improve national, regional, community and global cooperation and collaboration in prevention, detection, and control of zoonotic diseases.
Meeting frequency	Virtual monthly meetings or bimonthly (via Zoom platform), as appropriate

¹ [One Health High Level Expert Panel definition](#) - One Health is an integrated, unifying approach that aims to sustainably balance and optimize the health of people, animals and ecosystems. It recognizes the health of humans, domestic and wild animals, plants, and the wider environment (including ecosystems) are closely linked and inter-dependent. The approach mobilizes multiple sectors, disciplines and communities at varying levels of society to work together to foster well-being and tackle threats to health and ecosystems, while addressing the collective need for clean water, energy and air, safe and nutritious food, taking action on climate change, and contributing to sustainable development.

What contributions should members expect to make as part of their participation in ZDAP?

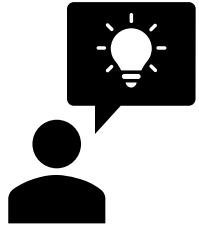
- Active participation and engagement in meetings, communications and ZDAP planning

ZDAP aims to support its members to develop or strengthen their capacity to prepare, prevent, detect, and respond to zoonotic disease threats, using a One Health approach by:

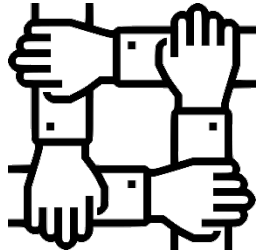
- Providing a forum for collaboration and sharing of experiences and expertise on zoonotic disease to inform members future planning and actions

Inclusive

Collaborative

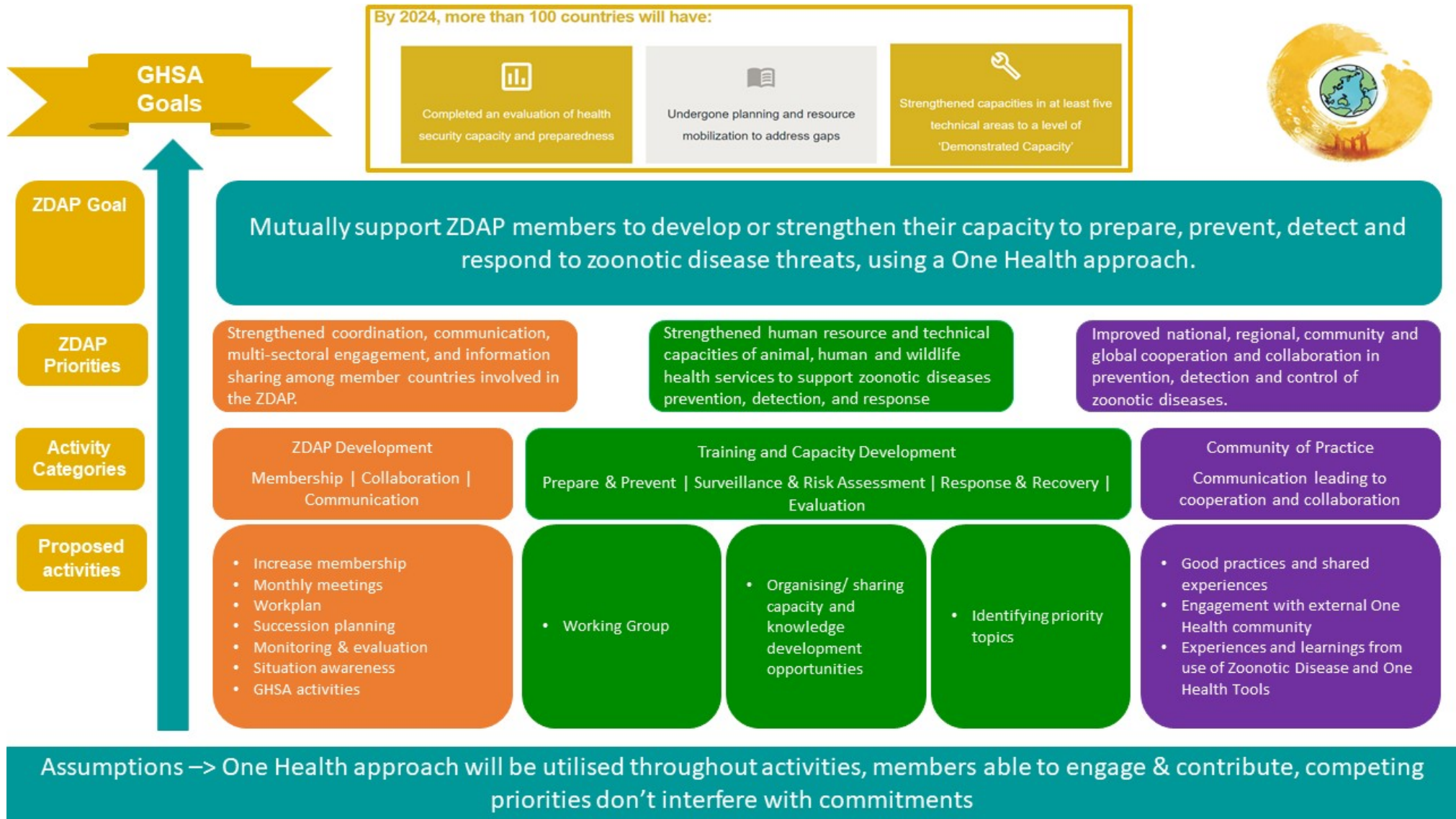
- **Partnership:** ZDAP members work collectively to improve health security at national, regional, and global level.
- **Supportive:** ZDAP members support each other to improve health security by sharing lessons identified, good practices, experiences, and training opportunities to improve capacity.
- **Work across technical areas:** ZDAP members identify opportunities to work with colleagues in other GHSA technical action packages to share learning opportunities.



Effective

- **Realistic goals:** the ZDAP workplan will be informed by, and created jointly with members ensuring all plans and goals are attainable with current resources.
- **Purposeful activities:** all ZDAP activities and meetings will be planned according to the workplan and to support core ZDAP objectives.
- **Monitoring and evaluation:** the impact and utility of ZDAP will be measured at regular intervals to ensure it is meeting key objectives and members expectations.
